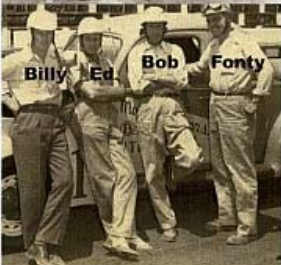


## Billy Carden

Carden was a true stock car racing pioneer, who started racing after World War II. Carden ran in NASCAR competition from 1949 to 1959, recording four top five finishes, 17 top tens, and 2 poles. Carden's best finish came in 1951 at Pine Grove Speedway in Shippenville, PA, where he finished third behind fellow Georgia Hall of Famer Tim Flock and John McGinley. After leaving the big circuit, Carden could be seen running the occasional late model event around the south.

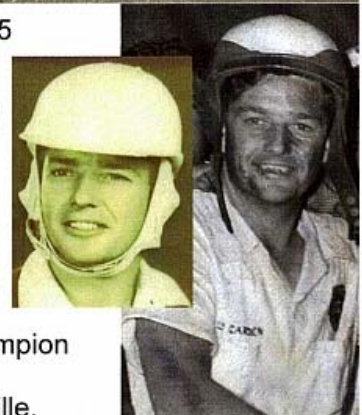


\*1947-Began his racing career raced for 15 years and ran his last race in 1962, winning many races  
Was issued the #8 for his car by Bill France, Sr.

\*1949-Ran his 1st race in Daytona-beach  
1950's-raced with his racing buddies Ed Samples, Bob Flock and Fonty Flock

\*1951-Ran Darlington Race, drove for car owner Al Dike until 1962

\*1962-Ran his last race - a GA racing champion and a great pioneer for our sport winning championships in Chatanooga and Nashville, Tenn., Huntsville and Birmingham, Ala. and in Georgia
